
2022 Financial Overview


2022's programmatic growth was made possible by the outstanding support of our donors, who continue to come alongside us in the work that we do. Those donors, too, are an important part of our community. As we believe in transparency, the following outlines the income and expenses for the year in detail.

Our income sources continue to be well diversified. In-kind donations continue to be central to our success, with gifts of food, supplies, and items from our wish list totaling \$33,491 this year (down about 30% from 2021). Monetary donations increased 11% from the previous year to a total of \$107,347 in 2022. Of the monetary income, grants totaled \$44,105 (up 8% from the previous year), corporate donors gave \$27,916, and personal donors gave \$17,234.

We are proud of the way we are able to focus our spending on our programs, with 88% of our expenses going directly to our services to families. Business expenses increased only 2% from the year 2021, and as always, we donated 5% of our unrestricted funds to the Children's Cancer Research Fund (bringing our 4-year total to more than \$10,000 given to see an end to child-hood cancer). Spending for the year totaled \$71,790.

We are forever grateful for those who continue to advocate for the importance of community developed at CCC, and are so humbled by the way you support our families through fundraising, speaking to your corporate leaders, and give in your own way to make a safe place of healing for our families.

November 19, 2021 will be a date I'll never forget. It's the day my daughter, Ellison, was diagnosed with leukemia at just 4 years old. It was a total shock and so hard to process. Her organs were starting to fail and 100% of her blood was cancer. We didn't know what her future would hold, but she has been so strong and brave.

While we have had trials and emergencies, overall Ellison has done very well throughout her course of treatment. Her doctors have been pleased with her amazing attitude and her progress as she enters her final year of treatment. Our faith in Jesus has sustained us throughout this entire journey, and we are closer as a family because of it.

CCC has been an amazing organization in their support of our family. They put so much thought into their gatherings to help make the pain of having a child with cancer not quite so hard. Recently, on Ellison's birthday she was given the choice to do whatever she wanted, and she chose to travel and attend the CCC Christmas party. There is something healing that comes with not feeling alone; to have a place where you feel cared for and understood.

Tabitha was diagnosed with optic pathway glioma in February 2019 at the age of 13. She underwent a craniotomy and nearly a year of chemotherapy at the time of diagnosis, and an additional year of chemotherapy upon evidence of new tumor growth in 2021. Due to her treatment, she is blind in her left eye with some limitations in her right eye. She will always have a brain tumor, but studies show that this cancer tends to behave itself after patients reach their early 20s. This is our hope.

Tabitha loves musical theater, singing, animals, baking, manicures/pedicures, and wants to become a child psychologist. While she has been accepted to the Berklee School of Music in Boston, she is staying closer to home for college.



In her own words, Tabitha says, "CCC is a community of people who understand what it's like to have cancer. I have great friends and family support, but they don't understand like our CCC family does." As a mom, I didn't think I needed support during her treatment, until I did. It was a relief to find CCC, and this group is invaluable.
